

- Planning & Consents

CCGT – Planning & Consents

- Stage 2 Formal Consultation concluded on 21st Dec
- Total of 152 people attended 6 off Public Consultations in Nov, generally positive feedback
- Planning Red-Line Boundary being finalised for DCO documentation preparation
- Project on schedule to submit DCO planning application in Q2 2019



CCGT – Governance & Utilities

- Agreement reached with Network Rail on the pipeline crossing location of their infrastructure. Physical survey of crossing point to be arranged.
- Meeting held with National Grid on 29th November to discuss crossing of HV infrastructure, actions arising being followed up.
- AGI location at Gateforth end of gas pipeline under review, to be finalised in January
- Consultation responses received from Northern PowerGrid and Northern Gas Networks, follow-up meetings to be arranged



CCGT – Design & Engineering

- Principal Inspection of Cooling Tower 2A completed and reported to be in good overall condition. Timing of inspections on remaining two towers to be confirmed.
- OEM site visit held on 13th Dec to further inform plant design and layout.
- Transportation assessment report from OEM has identified some "pinch points" on the road network to deliver the preferred electrical transformers. Review in hand to assess potential alternative routes and delivery methods, as well as alternative transformer configuration.



Multifuel 1 Operations

- Safety
 - FM1 achieved 1,000 days LTI free operation in July 2018
 - However, an operator received a minor caustic burn in one eye in November
 - This resulted in 3 days off work and is classed as an LTI.
 - Full recovery has been made with no long term damage.
- Environment
 - FM1 completed 2018 with zero CCS points and will have an EA OPRA rating of 'A' class.
 - FM1 Continues to perform at or above budgeted levels
- Opportunity to visit the FM1 plant on Tuesday 19th February 2019 at 11am
 - Register your interest with Jade at today's meeting



Multifuel 2 Operations

- Recruitment is virtually complete 3 positions still to fill.
- Plant process operational training has been completed.
- Some OEM specific training still to be completed.
- Project scheduled for completion September 2019

On 30th August we were contacted by a resident of Brotherton to advise of dust on her premises. The complaint was escalated to the ETEX Head Of Environment and Sustainability and also Roger Newman at Wakefield Council.

A visit to the resident's home followed very shortly after and an investigation begun.

The investigation by our Head of Environment & Sustainability included:

- · General arrangement of stacks and PCME sensors
- Inspection and maintenance of ports and filter units, July/ August 2018
- PCME readings for Vulcain Line 1 (main and cooler) for July/ August 2018
- · Calibration records for PCME sensors
- · Work instructions for PCME monitoring and complying with dust limits
- Alarm records from end trim stack (stack A13)
- Daily visual assessment log (as per site permit condition 5)
- Wet end scrap pile (now inside new gypsum shed and behind alpha block wall)
- · Other Hargreaves material movements
- Tanker deliveries of bulk powders, July & August 2018
- Maintenance and cleaning of gypsum delivery conveyors (following train unloading on 22 August)





The investigation concluded that there was no breach or failings in any of the internal process controls and likely to be due to the high winds on the day in question towards the complainant carrying ground dust from unspecified locations likely to also include the ETEX plant but not exclusive too.

A follow up conversation was had with the complainant 26th September where no further issues were reported and we have no further complaints since.

We have as a matter of routine replaced the dust filtration bags at cost of £46k which is standard practice for the site.


Ground sweeping and floor washing around the roads on site continue as always.

Following the plant conversion to natural gypsum all external conveyors to the site carrying gypsum are now contained on all sides preventing dust emission while being transported.

Waste reclaim traditionally held on site in the open is now stored inside the building and behind alpha blocks and will be used internally, eliminating removing it from site which could be dust causing.

Whole board waste that was held on the Brotherton side of the plant is now relocated to rear of the plant.







Last year we secured promotion to BES6001 Excellent status for Responsible Sourcing.

Noise



We are actively working on a recently received noise complaint that has come to us via Selby Council. An internal investigation is under way, we have responded to the council with an initial acknowledgement and will provide a full reply in due course.

We have received other noise complaints about train activity around 3am disturbing local residents. The ETEX operation does not have the necessary permitting conditions to allow for train movements to site at these times. The complaint was responded to confirming the ETEX site was not the offending site and the complainant replied to confirm they would pursue the complaint elsewhere.

- Prioritisation of CCGT development

- Brotherton Ings
 - SSE is required to provide a remediation plan to the EA by November 2019
 - For the foreseeable future, Brotherton Ings will be managed in accordance with the EA permit.
 - Feasibility of ash reclamation is being assessed
- Fryston Woods
 - Awaiting business proposal from Friends of Fryston Woods (now a CIC)
